St Andrew's Lent Course 2024: Being Disciples

Lent begins on 14 February 2024 - Ash Wednesday. Over the following 5 weeks, the St Andrew's Lent Course will be based on Rowan Williams' short book: <u>Being Disciples</u> (SPCK 2016). This is a readable and thoughtful book drawn from accessible talks that the former Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, gave to groups exploring what it means for us to be disciples of Christ in the contemporary world. I hope the book will help us as a church grapple with and gain confidence around questions of how we live a thinking, praying and generous faith everyday, beyond our Sunday gatherings. Once we are into February, there will be sign up sheets at the back of church for people to indicate in person which group they intend to join. We currently have venues for groups meeting on Tuesday morning, and Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings. If you think you might be interested in hosting or leading a midweek group on a Monday, or a potential second group on these other days, do please contact Philip soon.

Set in a small town in New England during the 1950s, the novel follows a religious leader, struggling with the death of his wife.
