Annual Christmas community events are back—and set to be better than ever

Christmas lights in the centre of Chesterton will be switched on in a popular annual event outside Chesterton Methodist Church—on Tuesday 5 December, 5.30pm. Everyone is welcome to join in the fun on the first Tuesday in December. The Mayor of Cambridge will be present, as will another VIP— for Father Christmas is rumoured to have plans to stop by! Light refreshments will be served outside. This event is organized in partnership by Cambridge City Council & Chesterton Methodist Church.

Later in the month, two Community Carols events take place:

- Outdoor Community Carols in the Park (Green End Road Park), Saturday 16 December, 5pm. Organized by Hope Church and St George's Church, Chesterton.
- Chesterton Community Carols in St Andrew's Church (Church St) Thursday 21 December, 6.30pm.

Organized by St Andrew's Church and the St Andrew's Hall to raise funds for WinterComfort— the homeless support hub. Local brass band, CSD Brass, will lead the sing-along. Christmas Refreshments will be served inside the church afterwards.

The Cambridge homelessness partnership— It Takes A City (ITAC) - has reopened its Crossways winter emergency accommodation in Chesterton this November.

Crossways provides a safe, secure home for some of our most disadvantaged rough sleepers from 1st November until the end of March. The project runs with the generous help of volunteers. Last year, those involved donated an amazing 2300 hours of their time. One volunteer, Barry, commented: 'I have thoroughly enjoyed being part of this amazing project and meeting such incredible people along the way'.

This year there are roles as Lead Cooks, Mealtime assistants, Week Day Housekeepers, Weekend Daytime Hosts and Social Activities Facilitators.



CITY COUNCIL OPENS APPLICATIONS FOR COMMUNITY PROJECT GRANTS

Area Committee Grants are for activities that reduce social or economic inequality

Have you got plans or ideas for a Council want these grants to neighbourhood activity that will take place between April 2024 and March 2025 and help to reduce inequality?

Voluntary or community organisations, or groups of local residents, could be eligible for an Area Committee Grant of up to £5,000 per area.

Area Committee Grants are for activities that reduce social or economic inequality for disadvantaged residents in one of the four areas of the city (North, South, East or West Central). Groups based in Arbury, December onwards for further East Chesterton, King's Hedges and West Chesterton wards can apply for a North Area Committee grant.

Activities that can be funded include those that reduce poverty, or items which enable an activity to happen such as venue hire for a local community art, sport or social activity or activities for people on a low income plus many more. The

Area Committee grants will launch on the 12 December. This year the application process is via an online application form, go to www.cambridge.gov.uk/areacommittee-funding to view the guidelines and access the application form. The deadline for applying is 31 January 2024 please note this is the same for all areas.

St Andrew's Church is a place that has long encouraged a love of music in Chesterton — through our Sunday choirs, midweek concerts, and groups for children and young people to learn to enjoy singing.

Minims is our singing group for 4-8 year olds that runs on Sunday afternoons in St Andrew's Church. They sing a range of songs about God and faith, from lively action songs to calm reflective songs. Every session, there are a few songs with sign language and a few songs sung in a round or with simple harmony. Children often work together to make up words to additional verses, or have fun with percussion instruments or colourful flags to wave.

The group meets on 1st and 3rd Sundays at 4pm. Knowing that life with young children is busy and unpredictable, there's no pressure to commit to coming to every session. Parents stay for the whole session and siblings are welcome to join in too, whether they're younger or older than the 4-8 age bracket.

Minims is a gentle and fun introduction to making music in a group and singing techniques. The time starts with a warm up, and ends with free biscuits and raisins! New young singers are always welcome. MINISTER'S LETTER

As the nights draw in and we approach and pass the shortest day, this is a season when many of us find ourselves longing for light. We are eager for the sun to lift the gloom and mist of a winter's day. We are cheered by fairy lights on trees, houses, and shopping streets. We are drawn to the soft, stilling light of candles in comfy homes or history-filled churches.

Christmas stands at the centre of this season – a festival of light in the winter darkness. Now it may be you tend to associate Christmas with something else before you think of light. May be you think of "presents" or "food" or "family" – either excitedly or stressfully!

But before all these other things, Christmas has actually always been about light. This is because, when the first Christians were coming to understand Jesus – and put the Christ in "Christ-mas" – they called him 'the true light' that had come into the world. This true light from God shone in the darkness – our world's darkness of war and disease, stuff messed up, stuff broken, stuff that hurts. As one early Christian writer put it: all that darkness could not overcome Jesus the light. Because God's light always conquers the darkness. I think of this being a bit like when we're afraid of the dark. Do you remember being afraid of the dark? May be you still are!

Well, what do we want more than anything when we're afraid of the dark, and worried and unsure about what's out there?

We want someone to put on the light. The light goes on, and the darkness goes. So we can see. See that it's ok. See who's there. See where to walk. And that's what Christians believe God has done by coming in Jesus. God has shown the light we can live by; shown the darkness will not win.

And that's what we really celebrate at Christmas. That God has switched on the light. God has been born in Jesus, so this true light can be with us and among us. This light has not gone; it stays with us in our darkness, in our worries, in our fears. God is here, bringing us comfort, bringing us joy.

I wish you all a peaceful, joyful and light-filled Christmas – and a flourishing New Year.
