A History of St Andrew's in 100 objects:

War memorials

The war memorial near to the north door was unveiled on 25 September 1920 by Mrs Rosalind Clark who lived in the Manor House. Her only son, Anthony, is among those commemorated. Thousands filled the recreation ground for a service led by the Bishop of Ely before the crowds processed to the churchyard. The names of those who died in the Second World War were added in 1994.

In the church, the south aisle chapel was dedicated in memory of those from St Andrew's who died in the First War, and on the south aisle wall is a fine memorial to Alec Johnson, Captain in the Cambridgeshire Regiment, 'who fell leading his men into action at Epéhy, France, Sept 18 1918, aged 22 years'. His nephew, Peter Johnson, is joining us for our Remembrance service and will be reading the first lesson.

There are a number of others buried in the churchyard who died in military conflict.
