On **Homelessness Sunday (30 January)** in the Leper Chapel (Newmarket Road) homeless and ex-homeless people are organising a programme that includes poetry, prose and music. It will run from 3.00 to 5.00pm and all are welcome to it. At the same time there will be an exhibition called *Heroes*, in the Chapel, that will run from Saturday 29th January to Sunday 6th February. The 'Heroes' are sculptures made by homeless and ex-homeless people and represent influences in their lives from Davina McCall to Kevin's grandfather in First World War uniform! It is very powerful and moving. The exhibition will be open on weekdays from 2.00 to 4.00pm, on Saturdays from 12.00 to 4.00pm and on the day of the event, the 30th, from 12.00 to 5.00pm.
