Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent this week. There will be services of Holy Communion (with ashes) at 12.30pm and 7.30pm. Following the evening service (which will be shorter than usual) the Revd Dr Philip Jenson will be leading a *Thinking our Faith* special—an introduction to the prophet Jeremiah, our bible book for Lent.

There is no **Silver** Threads meeting this month but all are invited to the pancake event (see above). The next date is 12 April.

The Wednesday Bible study is no longer meeting. However the **Thursday Bible study** will still meet each week in Lent, studying the gospel of Mark.

Lent 2011 at St Andrew's

We will be journeying with the prophet Jeremiah this Lent.

- Our 10am Sunday services will be looking at various pictures and images the prophet is given and uses to convey his message.
- Why not take up the Bible challenge for Lent and read through the whole book of Jeremiah (from the Old Testament)? The readings will be on the pewsheets—and the whole scheme is available on a separate sheet at the back of church or on the website.
- There will be **groups** that will be exploring Jeremiah through Lent (beginning next week, i.e. from 15 March)—ideally with members having done the daily readings. There is no central booking system but please let the relevant group know that you'd like to come:

- Why not take the opportunity of having a spiritual health check? The clergy would be delighted to meet with

individuals thinking through their spiritual lives and priorities.
