Bishop Stephen Conway has chosen the Bible Society's work in China as a **Lent giving project** for Ely Diocese. Over 40 years ago the Bible was banned in China, and if copies were found they were confiscated and often burned. Mao Tse Tung famously said the only place for a Bible was in a museum. In a much freer climate now, with great growth in the numbers of Christians in China, the supply of Bibles cannot keep up with demand. We are asked to contribute to the cost of the

rolls of paper used for printing.

What you can do: take a Bible Society sticker home and apply it to a container of your choice. Collect change until Easter, and then bring it back to church. Thank you.
