Following our AGM last Tuesday, the Hall Management Committee for 2011–2012 is now in situ. Development Project News

The annual meeting unanimously supported plans to proceed with phase 1 of the project, the reordering of the vestry areas (and provision of disabled toilet facilities) and the renovation and moving of the organ.

Some people have asked whether we have considered (the much cheaper option of) having an electronic organ and, as any substantial works on the pipe organ would require us to hire an electronic instrument for many months, we have agreed that it makes sense to test out such an instrument anyway. We are looking to install one for a month over the summer so that everybody can hear what it is like. The PCC, though, has certainly not committed ourselves to the electronic route or expressed a preference for it. Over the coming months we will also be meeting with at least two sets of traditional organ-builders to propose schemes for the renovation and re-siting of our current organ. The views of congregation members (and others) will be welcome throughout the process and we will keep you informed.

At the same time we will be consulting with the DAC (the diocesan planning group) and heritage bodies over our proposals.
