Our 10am service begins out of doors as we reflect on the Ascension of Christ.

Next Sunday is Pentecost, a major Christian festival in which we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. In the 10am service, nine of our children will be receiving at Communion for the first time.

But before that, on Thursday, six of our adults will be candidates for the Baptism & Confirmation service, 7.30pm, at St George's.
