St Andrew's News & Notices

The **PCC** (church council) met on Thursday evening. It decided:

- To conduct a survey amongst the congregation on the experiment with an electronic organ
- To share new chairs with the Hall (and new community cafe), costs to be sorted out between the finance committee and the Hall management committee
- To have two 2nd Sundays in the autumn when there will be a 'messy' Eucharist in the Hall alongside the Sung Eucharist in church
- Subject to health & safety arrangements and risk assessment, to experiment with having a parish office

in the vestries

- To consult with choir and congregation about the future of Matins (which will be discontinued in the autumn unless there is an appreciable increase in support and attendance)
- To continue publishing *Chesterton Chimes* whilst there are also discussions about a new community newsletter
- To take legal responsibility for the Hall table tennis club for the autumn term while it decides its long term future
