The **PCC** (church council) met on Thursday 30 June. It decided:

- To conduct a survey amongst the congregation on the experiment with an electronic organ
- To share new chairs with the Hall (and new community cafe), costs to be sorted out between the finance committee and the Hall management committee
- To have two 2nd Sundays in the autumn when there will be a 'messy' Eucharist in the Hall alongside the Sung Eucharist in church
- Subject to health & safety arrangements and risk assessment, to experiment with having a parish office in the vestries

- To consult with choir & congregation about the future of Matins (which will be discontinued in the autumn unless there is an appreciable increase in support & attendance)
- To continue publishing *Chesterton Chimes* whilst there are also discussions about a new community newsletter
- To take legal responsibility for the Hall table tennis club for the autumn term while it decides its long term future

Mary Simuyandi is the youth worker we support in the schools' 'Transitions' project (based in Romsey Mill but working in North Cambridge). She writes:

As I mentioned at the last NCCC meeting we are taking a group of ten young people to Falcon Camp this year, from 31st July-6th August. We are currently finalising plans and inviting the young people to attend. However, we are currently facing two hurdles in the planning of this camp.

Firstly we need a CRBed volunteer to accompany the young people and my colleague Naomi down to Somerset in the Romsey Mill minibus on Sunday 31st July. Romsey Mill will pay for the train journey back to Cambridge, and as the minibus will arrive in Somerset around lunchtime the volunteer won't need to spend the night away from home, but can return to Cambridge that afternoon.

Secondly we are asking the young people who are attending to contribute £25 towards the camp fees, which total £126. This leaves £101 per young person which
