The **PCC** (church council) met this week. We decided to:

- Make economies in the budget for this year to ensure that the congregation has a realistic & manageable target for raised giving
- Proceed with applying for a faculty for phase 1 of the development project (porch and ramp)
- Pursue the possibility of replacing the copper roof on the vestries (a portion of which was stolen before Christmas) with a less valuable alternative
- Support the new community newsletter and make the forthcoming edition of Chimes the last one (this will also save £1,500 from the budget)

We also confirmed that there will be a 'parish weekend at home' on the weekend of 18-20 May and that Belsey Bridge is now booked for a residential parish weekend on 12-14 April 2013.

A **CD of the music from the Carol Service** is available, as well as a CD of the Senior Youth Choir's Garland of Carols Concert. They put on a wonderful concert which includes some unusual Christmas music as well as some well-known items. We thought that a donation of £5 per CD towards the Youth Choir holiday fund would be appropriate.
