We are also organising a **Jubilee lunch** in the Hall on that day (tickets are £4.50, from Flori) and there will also be the chance to stay on to watch the Jubilee river pageant on a large screen.

On **Saturday 9 June** (7.30pm) there will be a **Jubilee Concert** at St Andrew's.
