**Giving Day for Cambridge FoodBank, 17 June.**

It may surprise you to hear that 15,000 people in Cambridge are living on the edge of poverty. Cambridge City FoodBank is an organisation that helps by giving people food and support when they need it most, when they are in a situation where they don't know where their next meal is coming from. This may be due to unexpected unemployment, benefit delay, debt, sickness etc. The FoodBank collects a variety of tinned and dried foods through supermarkets, churches, individuals, etc. and then gives those in crisis enough food for 3 days from one of their distribution centres.

As well as our financial giving on 17 June there is also an opportunity to collect food items – perhaps an extra tin of something while you are doing your weekly shop. The items needed by the FoodBank are listed below and there will be a box at the back of the church for you to place your items in.

This will hopefully be something we can continue to do long term.

- Milk (UHT or powdered)
- Fruit juice (carton – longlife)
- Tea Bags/Instant coffee
- Sugar (500g & 1kg)
- Cereals Soup Jam
- Instant mashed potatoes
- Tomatoes (tinned)
- Pasta sauces
- Rice/Pasta
- Tinned Meat/Fish
- Tinned fruit & vegetables
- Rice Pudding (tinned)
- Sponge Pudding (tinned)
- Biscuits or snack bars
