I am going to finish my current part-time work with the Mental Health Trust before we go to Peru on 24 July. Chaplaincy to People at Work has volunteer

chaplains who do visiting to a wide variety of workplaces over the county. In Cambridge, it includes the courts, police, Shire Hall, Ridgeons, the Swiss Laundry, St John's Innovation Centre and the Grafton Centre. Some people see faith as a leisure activity or Sunday hobby but we want to show that God's concern is for the whole of life. We also want to support the Christians who are 'sent out' each week at the end of worship 'to live and work to God's praise and glory'. I will value your prayers as I prepare to start this work.
