

Romsey Mill's alternative education (Step-up) programme is looking to recruit a GCSE Maths Teacher for 4 hours per week based at the Romsey Mill Centre. The Step-up programme provides excellent educational provision for young people who are struggling to engage with mainstream school. This role will involve teaching a small group of year 11 pupils GCSE maths for the academic year September 2012-July 2013. Although a formal qualification is not a requirement QTS and experience of working in the subject and with young people would be preferred.

The Jubilee Centre is organising two half day conferences on **Saturday 22 September** looking at Christian responses to the debt crisis, both globally and locally.
