Next April we will be returning to Belsey Bridge, Ditchingham, for another **Parish Weekend**. A leaflet (with booking form) will be distributed after our services this morning. Do please write the dates in your diaries now and book as soon as possible—don't just file it away!! The dates are 12-14 April 2013.

The PCC (church council) will be having a special meeting after church next Sunday to decide whether to support a bid for

establishing a new school in Green End Road (the old Shirley site) as a church school. We have a rising population of children locally and the county council has decided that the school must come out of mothballs and be renovated as a new school to open in September 2013. Because of recent legislation It cannot be set up as an LEA community school (unless all else fails) but they must seek potential sponsors for an academy (directly funded by government). On Monday evening our PCC met with our friends from St George's and Methodist representatives to hear from the Diocesan Director of Education, Tim Elbourne, about the process. Bids need to be in by the end of the year, which means that we need to decide whether to support it by the end of next Sunday (!). Your comments (to any PCC member) would be very welcome—as well as expressions of interest in supporting the new school (e.g. we would need to find governors).
