pilgrimage to Iona is rare. But between Monday 8 and Friday 12 April next year rooms are available for those wanting to experience the exhilarating atmosphere of the birthplace of what is commonly called Celtic Spirituality. Pilgrims take a train to Glasgow where they meet up with the rest of their pilgrims at the Holiday Inn Express Hotel there. People travelling alone are very welcome to join others who are also on board the pilgrimage. The journey continues the next morning, after a dinner together and a good night's sleep, with the "boat train" from Glasgow Queen Street to Oban. The ferry waits there for the train to arrive before setting off on its 45 minute cruise to the Isle of Mull. It is a glorious short cruise with, weather permitting, beautiful scenery. From there, pilgrims journey by coach across Mull to the small port of Fionnphort which has great views of Iona. The much smaller ferry takes just 6 minutes to go across the jetty on Iona where 3 days of relaxation, prayer, great food and company awaits all those who take part. Peter Millar writes: "We are not alone as our hearts see God's guidance – a thought which in itself is both comforting and restoring". The pilgrimage is accompanied by BBC Radio 4's *Thought for the Day* broadcaster, Revd Rob Marshall, who has been leading pilgrimages to Iona for over a decade. Rooms are limited. Book
