

The Vicar writes...

Most of us—though not all—at St Andrew's will have felt a great sense of disappointment and frustration following the failure of the legislation for women bishops to receive the necessary majority in the House of Laity of the General Synod. Many of us will deeply regret what messages it gives to women in ministry—and to women generally, in and outside the Church.

But all of us will probably be concerned at the impression of the Church this has left on the wider world.

Of course the Church should never simply ape what's going on in wider society—that is the way of 'the salt losing its saltiness'. I am not concerned if the world thinks the Church is too moral—but I am concerned if it thinks that it is unjust.

It sends me back to two parts of Scripture that we have looked at recently.

The first is the book of Jonah—the prophet who stands for the people of God (today that means us) who seem to make more of a mess of everything than the big, bad world (Nineveh) who, if only we got our act together and proclaimed the message faithfully, are willing to listen and respond.

The second is from last week's gospel: 'When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come.' And that's true of this situation: the end is still to come. Frustrating though this is for many of us, everyone accepts that the ordination of women bishops will come. In the light of eternity this is but a blip.

We need to crawl out on to the beach and head back for Nineveh...
