## Lent at St Andrew's

**Through Lent with Luke.** During Lent we

will be reading through Luke's account of the journey to Jerusalem (from 9.51). We are encouraging the reading of a portion of the narrative during each week (see below) and will be including passages from these in our morning and evening services. Lent groups on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings and Thursday afternoons will give the opportunity to share what we have been learning.

Our **evening services** during Lent will be at 6pm in the chancel (either a Taizé service or a Contemplative Communion) - both at 10am and 6pm we will be reading part of Luke's narrative.

During Lent there will also be another opportunity to join a **prayer triplet**. More details later, but you can let John Reynolds know if you'd like to take part.
