Through Lent with Luke

Beginning during the week 18-22 February

During Lent we will be reading through Luke's account of the journey to Jerusalem (from 9.51). We are encouraging the reading of a portion of the narrative during each week (see overleaf) and will be including passages from these in our morning and evening services. Lent groups on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings and Thursday afternoons will give the opportunity to share what we have been learning. There will be an introduction to the whole sequence during our Ash Wednesday services (13 February, 12.15pm and 7.30pm).

Before each week's session you will need to have read the portion of Luke's narrative. The two sermons on the preceding Sunday will be looking at two parts of the forthcoming week's section. We are planning to record these and make them available straightaway on the website (www.standrews-chesterton.org). You can either read the portions at one sitting or spread them over a whole week (overleaf is a reading plan that you can follow). Remember to begin on or even before Ash Wednesday so that you are ready for the first meeting. The reading plan is numbered rather than dated so that you can fit it in according to when your group is.

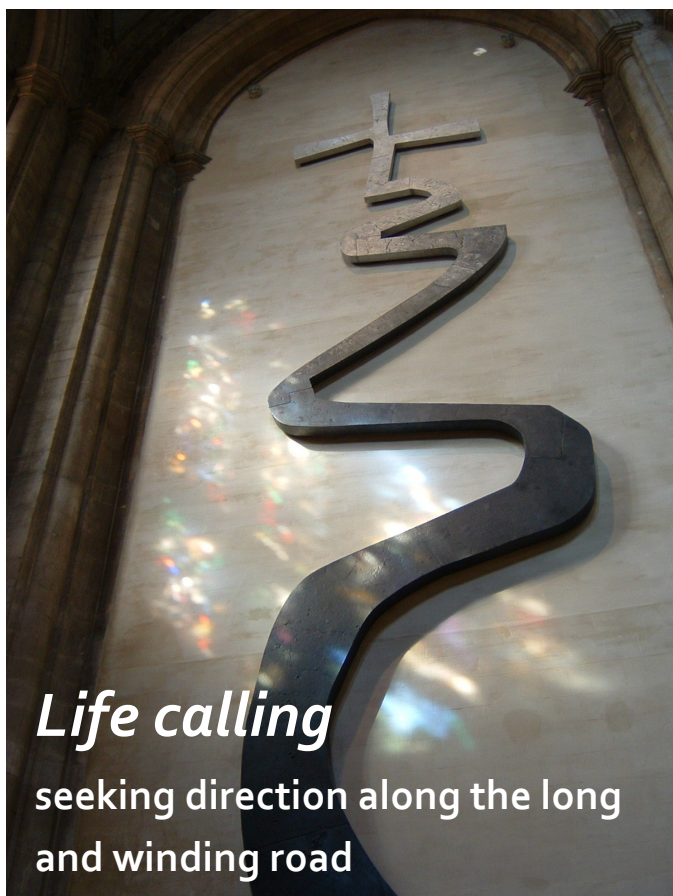

A five-week course for Lent Beginning during the week 22-26 February

The five-part course uses clips from the film *Billy Elliot* alongside Bible readings, prayer and group activities to help us reflect on the meaning of 'vocation'. The course reinforces the idea of vocation as much more than a calling 'to be a vicar' – it stresses that all Christians are called to explore their gifts and passions, and to use those in the service of the Church and the wider world.

Written by Kate Bruce, a chaplain at the University of Durham, and Canon Robert Warren, former Team Rector of St Thomas' in Sheffield, the course is the fourth in a series exploring how to apply Biblical teaching to daily life.
