Cambridge NightLite (formerly Safe Refuge) is now up and running on Saturday nights on a permanent basis. NightLite offers a companion service to Street Pastors offering a pastoral café accessible to all. Typically people use NightLite –

- As a safe place to be in a busy city
- To use the toilet facilities
- To meet up with friends (particularly after losing one another in town)
- A space to quietly 'recover' from excess prior to getting a taxi home
- To use the telephone
- To rest awhile if feeling unwell
- To be listened to (particularly if distressed, etc.)
- A place to wait for medical treatment
- A warm / dry place to wait for

As with Street Pastors, we only share our faith when asked about it (which is quite often in practice). NightLite is currently recruiting volunteers for this valuable work and witness to God's love:

- If you are over 18
- Belong to a Christian Church/Fellowship
- Are non-judgemental and want to witness to God's love in practical action
- Can commit to at least one night every 6 weeks

Then do consider being a NightLite Volunteer (training provided).
