The Cambridge City Foodbank is presenting '**Poor kids**', a film made for BBC2 by Bafta award winning director Jezza Neumann, at the ArtsPicturehouse on **Monday 14 October** at 7.00pm. The showing will be followed by a Q&A between the director and David Maher, Vicar of The Good Shepherd Church in Arbury. The hour-long film shows how poverty blights the lives of four children through lack of food, bullying, bad living conditions. Their stories are told directly by them, accounts which are articulate and moving. Jezza Neumann won Bafta awards for his 'China's stolen children' and 'Zimbabwe's forgotten children' and is currently working on his next film which will be about children in food poverty in Britain. NightLite operates every Saturday night providing care for anyone who needs it, e.g. a safe place to wait for friends or taxis, a place to recover from over indulgence in order to get home safely, a place to gain a listening ear, refreshment, toilet or access a First Aid kit and some practical help. Full training will be given and attendance at one of the Briefing Evenings on 10 September or 8 October would mean volunteers could expect to join a team in October or November.
