The showing will be followed by a Q&A between the director and David Maher, Vicar of The Good Shepherd Church in Arbury. The hour-long film shows how poverty blights the lives of four children through lack of food, bullying, bad living conditions. Their stories are told directly by them, accounts which are articulate and moving. Jezza Neumann won Bafta awards for his 'China's stolen children' and 'Zimbabwe's forgotten children' and is currently working on his next film which will be about children in food poverty in Britain.
