

chapel on Saturday nights. This is really useful as a safe place for the pastors to take vulnerable people. There are over 60 volunteers. I am now Chair of the trustees. Cambridge Street Pastors has been greatly blessed over the past 3 years by support from the Community Safety Partnership in the form of an annual grant of £5,000. We have been very grateful for this. However this support was provided on a 3-year programme and we have received confirmation that the grant cannot be continued in 2014. This has created a financial crisis for the next 6 months and we need to reach out to the community for urgent assistance. We are actively chasing other grant support but need help now to plug the £5,000 gap.
