A caring nature and a heart for people along with an ability to stay awake are all that's required, as there will be adequate training provided. This covers 2 sessions and then volunteers can opt into aspects of the wider Street Pastor Training Course as they wish. We do not pro-actively share our faith but, when asked about it, we are always ready to do so. If you are over 18, belong to a Church/Fellowship and can provide 2 references, one of which needs to be your pastor/minister, then do think about whether God is calling you to be part of this work for *his* Kingdom.
