- Linda Church (Director Ministry) attended our meeting to give an overview of Nick's new role in ministry training. Nick will be establishing a new learning centre based at St Andrew's Hall for the training of ordinands and lay ministers from the Ely diocese. While his involvement will be tempered by the needs of the Parish, Nick will delegate as necessary to our new curate, Helen Orr, and noted there are many gifted people to share ministry at St Andrew's.
- We were extremely pleased to elect Mark Thomas as our new PCC treasurer.
- We agreed to purchase music (and some words) copies of Ancient and Modern,

the latest hymn book in the Hymns Ancient and Modern stable. The St Andrew's Trust (NB not the Friends this time...) have agreed to support this purchase in memory of (and with the bequest from) former choirmaster, Barry Eaden.
