We were saddened to hear that several of the children at Azul Wasi had spent Christmas with toothache. There is no free dental or healthcare in Peru, and visits to the dentist only happen when there is a real need. We are planning to raise some extra money on top of our normal donation for food (£675 per month), so that the children can all have a dental check-up and any treatment necessary. We have decided to hold some occasional Pudding and Wine Evenings at our house (13 Leys Road). The first of these will be on Tuesday 28th April at 8pm. We will need to know numbers, so please let Mary know if you would like to come on this date, or would be like to be informed of a future date. The annual sponsored walk (about 10 miles) will be on Sunday 19th July.
