Azul Wasi news

Recent news from CMS mission partners John and Rachel Waters, whom St Andrew's supported at the last Mission Gift Day, is that they have returned to Northern Iraq to

continue their work with the Kurds. John has been working on translating the New Testament into Sorani Kurdish and has been testing the text out on eight locals for them to check that it is both comprehensible and sounds natural. This is really ground breaking work. Rachel continues to teach English to refugees. Besides praying for their work and safety especially in these volatile times, please pray for the refugees to be welcomed into Iraqi Kurdistan for the lawlessness elsewhere in the country to be held back.
