Friends of Midsummer Common (FoMC) was formed by Cambridge people concerned with the good management and responsible use of the Midsummer Common, the wonderful area of ancient grassland which provides one of Chesterton’s links with central Cambridge. Our mission is to make the Common a place for everyone to enjoy. The Common is a heavily-used area (see the FoMC website <http://midsummercommon.org.uk> for further information) providing, as it does, a car-free route into the centre and accommodating events throughout the year. FoMC highlights problems, raises issues/concerns, gives feedback on the effects of major events on the Common, and maintains close links with Cambridge City Council and other

groups interested in the management of the area. FoMC has established and cares for the Community Orchard (beside the allotments on the Newmarket Road side of the Common), and encourages volunteers to help with planting trees and wildflowers, cutting grass and clearing weeds in a sociable environment. Recently we have worked with Action for Swifts to make suitable nesting boxes which have been installed under the Elizabeth Way Bridge – if you are in the area in the morning or evening you may hear the recording of swift calls being played to attract birds to the boxes. We are now working on the installation of bat boxes to support the local bat population. We welcome new members from any part of Cambridge and, indeed, people who care for the Common.

Minister's Letter

Dear friends

People don't always find it easy to talk about their funeral – or, in fact, anything to do with death or dying. The Church of England has been one of a number of organisations that has begun to provide space for people to do so – in the 'safe' environment of a café. We thought we would provide such a space at St Andrew's Hall on Friday 13 November at 12.30pm (food available from the food4food café) and at 8pm (coffee & cakes) – there is no significance in the date! Each event will last about an hour. We won't be providing any right answers but, using 52 questions on conversation cards, will give you the opportunity to talk and share thoughts with a few others at your table about some of the big questions concerning death, dying and funerals. Do come along – you don't need to book beforehand, but just turn up at 12.30pm or 8pm. You'll need to pay for your lunch; donations for the coffee and cake.

Why in November? Well, at St Andrew's (as in many churches) we have an annual remembering service early in the month (in the All Souls season) when those who have lost loved ones come to remember them and lay flowers. This year it will be on Sunday 1 November at 4pm. All are welcome - many come from a distance because their loved one's funeral has been conducted at St Andrew's or by one of our clergy - and there will be a cup of tea afterwards.

But we also realise that Christmas, and the season leading up to it, can be a really difficult time for the bereaved. So this year we are going to have an early Christmas tree – not decorated fully for the festive season until later, but from the St Andrew's festival weekend (28-29 November) with stars carrying the names of those we are remembering.

For those who would like to explore these issues from the standpoint of Christian faith, our Sunday services during November will be exploring the themes – traditional for this time of year - of death, judgement, heaven and hell. That may sound rather foreboding, but I think we need to acknowledge the darkness in all these things before we get to see the light. During Advent we light candles – more each week – as we approach Christmas. We start in darkness and, one by one, the lights come on until the great Christmas celebration of the coming of the Light of the World. But more of that in the next issue...
