Minister's Letter

Do you know how the date of Easter is calculated? Look it up and you will find that Easter falls on the Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox, BUT it has to be an *ecclesiastical* full moon and not just any old full moon..... And then there's the issue of synodic months, tropical years and the Metonic cycle. Are you still with me?

Perhaps then it's not surprising that Christians have found it hard to agree about the date of Easter. It was one of the two major issues (the other being about haircuts) that the Celtic and Roman branches of the church in Britain couldn't agree about. The matter was resolved at the Synod of Whitby (in 664 A.D.); the Roman faction won and hence the church in Britain has celebrated Easter on the same date as the rest of Europe ever since. (Except that the Orthodox churches of eastern Europe and beyond don't agree and celebrate Easter on a different date).

So, an early victory for the pro-Europeans.... There have been attempts to rebel against these pesky and illogical continental regulations. Parliament even went as far as passing the Easter Act in 1928 that, if implemented, would have led to a fixed date for Easter in the week of 9-15 April. But no government has dared to implement it.

But now, it seems, the Archbishop of Canterbury may be instrumental in achieving what 1,500 years or more of Christian history and debating has failed to achieve – an agreement on a (fixed) date for Easter.

I mention all this because

you might have noticed that Christians are pretty good at disagreeing with one another; much of what you read or hear in the news is about such squabbles. Those outside the church – and many of us within – look on and think 'How can they be arguing about *that*'?

But it's not just the church. Indeed, it's not just religion: political parties, for instance, are just the same. People who believe in things disagree with those who have different convictions, even (and perhaps especially) if they are in the same party or group. If we all believed the same things we would never be challenged to change. It is those who dare to think differently – and therefore to cause friction and disagreement – who are the ones who change the world.

In the run of things, *when* we celebrate Easter doesn't matter too much (perhaps even the churches will realise that). It is *what* we celebrate at Easter that matters – or rather *who*: a changemaker who challenged pre-existing ideas and was turned upon and seemingly done away with because of that.

But Easter matters because that wasn't the last word. In the end truth, love and justice triumph because the Crucified One is now the Risen and Exalted One. And that is worth celebrating – on whatever day they decide....
