

Rob Pinney is a professional documentary photographer who has focussed on photography and conflict. He grew up next door to St Andrew's Church, went to school at Chesterton Community College and Hills Road 6th Form College - and was a member of St Andrew's Youth Choir. Rob's *Calais Jungle/Participatory Photography Project - The Jungle: Through my Eyes* is planned to be a body of work that takes professional documentary and news photographers out of the picture entirely, instead putting the camera in the hands of those who live in the Jungle so they may begin to tell their own stories. Above all, this project is about empowerment. It is about giving those who have been systematically stripped of their futures control over how they are now presented to the world. The project will work with 5-7 people and was initially planned for March 2016. At the moment, the timescale is up in the air because of the ongoing eviction.
