Mission & Giving News

As a church, we have recently twinned some of our toilets, our new one in church and two in the Hall, with three latrines in the Philippines, Uganda and India. This is helping flush away poverty! Toilet Twinning raises funds to support water and sanitation work in some of the poorest countries on earth. By supporting Toilet Twinning's vital mission, we are helping to do something about the fact that 2.5 billion people don't have somewhere safe and hygienic to go to the loo. This will help some of the world's poorest people gain access to safe sanitation, clean water and hygiene education. Over 500,000 children die every year from diarrhoea caused by unsafe water and poor sanitation. That's

Azul Wasi News

As a result of an exceptionally good year of fundraising and an increase in regular donations, we have been able to increase our monthly donation to £725 from this month. In addition, we have sent a one-off donation of £1,000. This will be used as follows: one of the boys, Humberto, had to have a tumour on his hand removed and we have paid for this operation (£190). We have set up a medical fund (£310) (operated by LAFF), so that, when there are medical expenses, Alcides can draw from this straight away – there is no NHS in Peru! The remaining £500 we have given to Alcides to spend as needed (possibly for furniture for their new dormitory and living room). There will be a Newsletter during May with more news.
