## Deal or No Deal



Councillor Tim Bick gave an enlightening talk on the City Deal to the Joint Annual Meeting of Chesterton Community Association and Old Chesterton Residents' Association on 30 June. The City Deal is an attempt to sort out some of Cambridge's infrastructure problems by throwing money at them. So far it has mainly been about transport interventions aimed at dealing with congestion.

Unfortunately the proposals to widen the radial routes into Cambridge to provide bus and cycle lanes impact directly and adversely on what are essentially residential and local shopping streets. These ideas have not been accepted by Cambridge residents and have provoked the formation of new and very active local residents' associations to meet the challenges posed by City Deal to their environments and their daily lives. ### New developments

Planning Applications have been submitted for rebuilding **Milton Road Library** and the new **cycle and pedestrian bridge** on the Ditton Meadows side of the railway bridge over the Cam. These proposals are not uncontested but have emerged after two or more years of discussion with local people. The Planning Committee is expected to consider them in September. Also, plans for a new **club room at the pavilion** in Chesterton Recreation Ground are in preparation and it is hoped they will proceed to planning this autumn.

**Remembrance Day** this year is on **Sunday 13 November**. Our morning service is at 10am and concludes with the Act of Remembrance around the war memorial at 11am. This year we will be reflecting especially on the Battle of the Somme and its impact on our local community. We invite you to wear your poppy and come and join us. In the evening our New Voices choir will be singing Duruflé's Requiem in its liturgical setting to round off our season of remembering and remembrance.

## Letter from a minister

So how has your summer been? Maybe it feels like it hasn't finished yet? Perhaps you are caught up in the beginnings of a new school year with its need for new uniform and helping to get used to new teachers, or even a new school or nursery? You may be waiting for the return of students to study? Or maybe it feels like summer did not affect you greatly and nothing much changes for you?

As evenings continue to draw in and we begin to sense the arrival of Autumn, I know that I will once again be conscious of the **wonder** of the natural world in which we humans take our place. In many schools and churches the traditions of Harvest Festival will be celebrated. Gardens, parks and fields will begin to reveal the **beauty** of the changing season.

It can be easy to miss this sense of **wonder** and **beauty** if we are anxious. Anxious about our personal lives or

families, anxious about how we might pay the bills this winter, anxious about the challenges of the political situation in Europe or all around the globe.

I'll carry on doing what I can to celebrate and remind people of the hope that I see in the world around us. In the changing colours, in the excited child walking to school, in the help offered to a neighbour, in the welcome shared with someone who arrives in our community from a far-away place, in any number of different **wonderful** and **beauty-filled** ways.
