Lent

Ash Wednesday is on **1 March**. There will be two services of Holy Communion and the Imposition of Ashes—at 12.15pm and 7.30pm. The evening service will include William Byrd's setting *Mass for Four Voices*.

The first weekend of Lent will have different arrangements. Children and families (and others too!) are invited to a weekend **Journey into the Desert**. There will be a Lent story trail at St George's on **Saturday 4 March**, 3-5pm (pop in any time) and a holiday club-style all-age act of worship at St Andrew's on the Sunday afternoon at 4pm (**5 March**); the morning service that day will be a Parish Communion, not an all-age service.

A reminder to sign up for Lent groups: 5 weekly sessions to explore Christian discipleship together. This year we'll be using the diocesan materials, "All Loves

Excelling", a study of Philippians. We'll consider the themes of joy, thankfulness, friendship and the imitation of Jesus Christ, through music, testimony, group discussion and study. **Starting from Monday 27 February**.
