There will be a **Taizé service** at St Clement's, Bridge Street, this **Friday**, 7.30pm.

You are invited to a "Centering Prayer Introductory Workshop" on **Saturday 22 April**, 10am-4pm, at St James's, Wulfstan Way. Centering Prayer is a way of silent prayer taught by Cistercian Abbot Fr. Thomas Keating OCSO. Contemplative Outreach is the global organisation he founded to spread the teaching of the practice. The workshop will consist of four talks on the method of Centering Prayer, its grounding in the Gospels and the spirituality of the early Church and what it means to live in relationship with the Risen Christ. There will be two 20-minute periods of silent prayer so that attendees can come away with first hand experience.
