Thank you so much for your contributions to the Grade-One-A-Thon..... I have passed Grade One on the Euphonium! The Oxford and Cambridge Note-Race has raised nearly £90,000 funds for HomeStart, Blue Smile and the Alf Dubs children's fund. Cambridge members of this Note-Race raised nearly £65,000, and Oxford GOATs around £35,000. We were examined by Trinity College of Music and then put on a concert in West Road which included specially composed orchestral items and two choral pieces - 'High on a hill was a lonely goatherd' and 'Somewhere over the rainbow'. We had an amazing day after some ten weeks of blowing, banging, and bowing on unfamiliar instruments. Sponsorship remains open until October 10th so let's hope the final total reaches £100,000 so that some of the misery for refugee, underprivileged and disturbed children is alleviated.
