A talk exploring the life's work of Robert Grosseteste, a remarkable medieval thinker and inspiration for the 'I See' installation on the Senate House will take place at the beginning of the e-luminate festival on Friday 9 Feb, 3pm. Colour and Light dominate the thought of one of the most remarkable medieval thinkers, Robert Grosseteste. Later Bishop of Lincoln, Grosseteste (c.1170-1253) was one of the most dazzling minds of his generation, church leader, political advisor, theologian, teacher, and scientist. Indeed, in a series of works from c.1195 to c.1228 Grosseteste explored natural phenomena from

cosmology to the rainbow. A key part of his thought focuses on light and colour: light the building block of the Universe, colour its embodiment in transparent media. Bringing together scientists, medieval specialists and artists, the Ordered Universe Research Project is dedicated to new analyses of Grosseteste's works. So, if you want to find out about the medieval big bang, and the colours of the rainbow, come and find us!
