New Volunteer guides needed: Jubilee Centre has commissioned an exhibition by the eminent Christian sculptor Liviu Mocan,

which will be on display outside Great St Mary's church on King's Parade, here in Cambridge, from the unveiling on 23rd July to the end of the year.
