Volunteer guides needed: Jubilee Centre has commissioned an exhibition by the eminent Christian sculptor Liviu Mocan, which will be on display outside Great St Mary's church on King's Parade, here in Cambridge, from the unveiling on 23rd July to the end of the year. The five brass sculptures are inspired by the five solas of the Reformation (sola scriptura, sola gratia, solus Christus, soli Deo gloria, and sola fides) but, to connect
