The **funeral of Barbara Hilton** will be on **Tuesday**, 10.45am, at Cambridge Crematorium (East Chapel).

On **Wednesday** at 7.30pm in St Andrew's Church, see the **Gospel of Luke**, memorised word for word from the Bible, told with the passion and surprise of an eyewitness account. In a compelling ninety minutes, the words come alive with the urgency and humour of someone who was there.
