Coronavirus precautions

Updated St Andrew's—and the Church of England in general—has a responsibility to heed national advice given by the health experts in the context of a potential epidemic. That advice currently states the following:

- Parishioners with coughs and sneezes should refrain from handshaking during the Peace and receive Communion in one kind only.

- At present, there is no Government advice that suggests the use of the Common Cup should be suspended but this will change if and when the virus spreads more widely.
- Intinction (dipping the wafer into the chalice) is not recommended as this represents an infection transmission route as well as a risk to those with certain allergies.
- Clergy and communion administrators should wash their hands, preferably with an alcohol-based (minimum 60%) hand-sanitiser.
- All of us should wash our hands regularly and thoroughly (including before coming to church please!).
