## Communication

There are a number of ways we will be helping keep you in touch:

- The **pewsheets** will appear every Friday and will be posted on the website and distributed by email to those who have asked for it.
- The [website](#) will be updated regularly.
- There are new **St Andrew's social media accounts**—Facebook and Instagram: press the buttons on the homepage of the website. There will be regular postings on these.
- We are ringing round to make sure no-one feels isolated.

## Virtual meetings & services

The website has this week's diary complete with links to each event's virtual community. There are three systems for joining in: (the first two allowing those watching also to take part)

- Most small group meetings will be using the **Hangouts Meet** platform—it is the simplest to use and the quickest to link into.
- Some meetings will use the more advanced **Zoom** platform—this gives greater versatility (enabling us, for instance, to divide into smaller groups).

- Bigger services and some smaller ones will be livestreamed on our Youtube channel - that will be like watching on television.

All you need to do is click on the (coloured) title of the meeting (on the website list) at the appropriate time and then follow any instructions.

## Maundy Thursday

### Last Supper, 6pm

We are still planning to share a meal together, just from our separate homes, with our laptops (or other device) on the table as we eat. Log in at 6pm as we share a pre-supper drink. The service proper will start at 6.15pm during which, after a short introduction and grace we can eat our meal together. We will divide people into groups so that we are able to have a conversation with one another. We will finish well before 8pm so that we can all go out and show our support for the NHS. The watch will follow after this. Contact Kathryn for a link to join in (i.e. you need to RSVP—but last minute responses welcome!)

### The Watch, 8.05pm

The drama moves into the church (virtually) where we spend an hour watching and praying in the Garden of Gethsemane and in the courtyard of the High Priest.

## Good Friday

### Procession & Family Service, 12 noon

We will be 'processing' (virtually of course) from one house to another as we hear the story of Good Friday. There will be readings as well as songs and prayers for all ages to join in with. You might like to gather a few stones, either from your garden or on your daily walk, ready for the service, along with finding a cross (could be a holding cross or a larger one) if you have one, prior to the service. You might even like to make a cross between now and then.

## The Last Hour, 2pm

A service of traditional hymns, readings and reflections (punctuated by silence) based on St Matthew's story of the Crucifixion.

## Holy Saturday

### Lighting of the new fire & Easter Vigil, 8pm

The service will begin out of doors in a garden where the new fire will be lit and, from it, the Easter Candle which will then move indoors and be alight during our vigil. You are invited to begin the service in the twilight (turning your lights off) and then light your own candle 'from' the Easter one and have that and the light from your screen as the sole lights during the vigil. You may also want to have to hand something with which to make a joyful noise (but don't wake up your children/neighbours!)

## Easter Day

### Holy Communion, 8am

A traditional service, using the Book of Common Prayer, beamed live from the vicar's desk!

### All-age Communion, 10am

The service begins with welcoming the newly lit Easter candle and celebrating the Risen Christ by making a joyful noise—you will need a bell, whistle, trumpet, blower, drum or anything else you can think of. We want to hear the noise right across Chesterton!

### Evening Prayer, 5.30pm

A quiet, said service from the Book of Common Prayer to round off the day.

There will be the opportunity to meet and chat online after our morning services—simply click on the relevant title in the diary list on the website. For coffee at 11am first go to the Hatch and if it's a bit busy try one of the other links for a smaller group—Table or Garden!
