New The PCC (church council) met on Monday. It heard that the new online giving facility had added £600 to church funds (though in the same timeframe we would have received about £1,000 in the collection plate). The council decided to:

- look towards September for a rescheduled annual meeting
- have a series of 10am services in June/July celebrating some of the things we've been appreciating during lockdown, beginning with music, pets and craft.
- have a series of midweek teas in June with some show-and-tell demonstrations of hobbies/crafts
- donate £300 to the project providing food for the homeless (and to raise further funds via the website)
- Apply for a faculty to install a new low-level board in the churchyard giving information about its wildlife and history

New The online collection for **Christian Aid Week** has yielded a total of £1,185 so far. Gift Aid at 25% will be added to many of the individual donations.
