### St Andrew's News

*New* You may have seen that it is now permitted for churches to be open for private prayer as of Monday. We are anxious to have the church open as soon as we can, but this week also sees the arrival of our contractors to set up the building works associated with the organ project. So though we have done our risk assessment and are ready to open the

church, it will be later next week or possibly the week after that we are able to do so.

We have also been planning for when we will be allowed to hold services again in the church. We will be restricted in numbers and there will need to be social distancing as well as enhanced cleaning regimes. It is also quite likely that singing will not be permitted. At least in the first instance we will be planning a blended economy of worship—in the church and online. We will certainly ensure that those unable to be present physically will be included online.
