### St Andrew's News

*New* You will be aware that **churches will be allowed to open for worship** from 4 July. This is good news—but unfortunately we still (writing on Friday morning) don't know what guidelines and rules will be in place—numbers allowed, length of service, singing, etc. The PCC has therefore decided that in order to be able to plan properly, and ensure that we have the right protocols in place, we do not intend to have public services in church on Sunday 5 July (next week). We are developing a plan to allow a gradual return to worship in church from Sunday 12 July. We anticipate that livestreaming services will continue for some time to come (and, perhaps, for ever!). When we do return to church it will not be the same as we were used to and we are going to have to get used to doing things differently—including booking 'tickets' for church before we come so that we can ensure we do not exceed our capacity. When the time comes I will write to you all explaining the new world we will be entering into....

*New* We are so grateful to all who give financially to sustain the life of our church. The good news is that despite our current global health crisis regular giving via standing order or direct debit has increased. The bad news is that our weekly cash collections (which raise almost £1,000 a month) have, of course, disappeared. The introduction of our online 'Donate' button has helped (£650 in two months) but there is still a big hole. Even when we return to church we won't be able to take up cash collections in the same way for a long time to come, so could we encourage those of you who give by cash to consider either joining one of our regular giving schemes (contact Linda or Simon: contacts overleaf) or to contribute by cheque or bank transfer (Linda will give you bank details). We will be setting up one or two more systems for giving in the next few weeks but meanwhile do discover the joy of pressing the 'Donate' button!

The **food project for feeding the homeless** is still going strong based at St Andrew's Street Baptist Church. For the next few weeks we are looking for an extra volunteer deliverer on Saturday mornings from 11.45am to 12.45pm.
