Back into the church?

The PCC (church council) met in July and decided on our pattern of worship for the next two months.

August

- The **8am Holy Communion (BCP)** will be in church each week (and livestreamed via YouTube)
- At **10am** each week there will be an online **All-age Service**.
- There will be **no** evening services throughout the rest of August
- **no need to book a space for any of these services**

September

- The **8am Holy Communion (BCP)** will continue as before.
- There will be a new pattern of services later in the morning. See the box opposite.
- There will be one Sunday a month (the 1st Sunday) where we try to bring together as many as possible at our main morning service. On the other Sundays the 10am service will be livestreamed and not in church.
- Following national guidelines the 11am Communion services will not include any congregational singing; there will be music played at the beginning, during and at the end of the service.
- There will be a short break at 11.25am (when music will be played); those who have 'attended' the earlier online service will be welcome to join those in church for communion.
- There will be a new online system for reserving seats (with a telephone option for those who can't access the online provision). More details to follow...
- All evening services/events will be online.

financially to sustain the life of our church. The good news is that despite our current global health crisis, regular giving via standing order or direct debit has increased. The bad news is that our weekly cash collections (which raise almost £1,000 a month) have, of course, disappeared. The introduction of our online 'Donate' button has helped (£650 in two months) but there is still a big hole. Even when we return to church we won't be able to take up cash collections in the same way for a long time to come, so could we encourage those of you who give by cash to consider either
