News from Azul Wasi

Since we wrote in November, the situation in Peru regarding Covid-19 has continued to be catastrophic and the progress of a vaccination programme has been very slow. Overcrowded living conditions, the poor state of the health service prior to the pandemic and the lack of financial support for individuals who have lost their work has added to the suffering of the people of Peru.

Keeping everyone safe at Azul Wasi has always been a priority and the staff have taken the health of everyone there very seriously. They and the children at Azul Wasi are currently all well and managing OK, despite the difficult circumstances with the prolonged lockdowns and curfews. Alcides is the father-figure at Azul Wasi and is assisted by the tutors, David, Carolina and Génesis. Anastasia, the cook for many years, has left and a new cook, Idersiz, is living at Azul Wasi with her 3 children. In April Azul Wasi welcomed 2 new boys, brothers aged 6 and 12.

LAFF

Home-schooling, solar powered laptops and IT provision

Azul Wasi has continued to be in a strict lockdown and the schools have been closed for over a year. The added responsibility of becoming a school as well as a home, with such a wide range of ages and with limited supplies and facilities has been very challenging and exhausting for the staff. Those here who have been home-school their children this year, will no doubt sympathise with them as they have 23 children and young people and currently have students in all primary and secondary year levels!



One of the biggest problems regarding supporting the children's education has been the limited number and the age of their computers – many of the computers don't have webcams and are very old and slow. The school had asked that every child should have a way to join online classes and so Azul Wasi needed to provide at least one phone or tablet computer per year level.

We have in the past responded to occasional emergency situations such as dental care, extra blankets, and the flooding issues back in 2010, and after speaking with Alcides and Macarena in April, we decided to send an extra

one-off donation of £510 to LAFF to enable them to provide some of this much-needed IT equipment at Azul Wasi. This will be a positive help in this difficult time and also be useful in the future too, as even when the schools do re-open they may well continue with some online educational provision.

LAFF have themselves provided a tablet, and following their recommendations our donation has been used to buy 2 tablets and a Wawa laptop. The laptop is an interesting option as it made in Peru and is an eco-friendly and sustainable laptop designed specifically for students. It can be powered by solar energy as well as mains electricity and is designed to last up to 15 years.
